Welcome to our Christmas edition of Nine Lives:

A publication produced for our wonderful members, supporters and Furever Home family members all of whom play an essential role in helping our Society care for and re-home cats in need.

2020 has been a year like no other; a year when the Covid health pandemic hit and had a major impact in Victoria in particular.

At the beginning of Covid, our Society made the decision to temporarily close our Adoption Shelter and Veterinary Clinic and the cats seeking refuge at our Shelter were placed into the care of our amazing Foster Care Network. However, with so many Victorians spending more time at home than ever and seeking the companionship of a pet, we were inundated with enquiries from people wanting to adopt a cat or kitten in need.

With the aim that we could continue to care for and re-home cats in need whilst keeping our team and the local community safe, we introduced adoptions by online application and appointment and the response was nothing short of amazing. Since being introduced in April, we have received over 2800 applications and for the first time in our 70+ year history, we have faced a "supply and demand" challenge with not enough cats available to cater for the demand from the public which has continued even whilst restrictions around Covid have eased. This increase in demand has meant that cats and kittens are spending less time at our Shelter before being adopted and older cats / cats with behavioural concerns who may have previously been overlooked are also being adopted relatively quickly which is a fantastic outcome.

Despite the craziness brought on by Covid, our Society has still been able to proudly re-home 850+ cats and kittens in need this year and has looked after over 450+ cats in our private, feline dedicated vet clinic. Our Foster Care program continues to play an essential role in the number of cats we can care for and re-home, with an incredible 300+ cats and kittens having spent time in Foster Care this year.

And as 2020 draws to a close, we were thrilled to (finally) open the doors to Victoria's largest dedicated shelter for cats in mid-November which will have an incredible impact on the number of cats we can provide refuge to and re-home moving forward. Our new shelter includes an adoption centre, private vet clinic, education classroom and café (opening 2021)- you can learn more on pages 12 & 13.

During a year that has presented us all with so many challenges, we could not be more grateful for your continued support, because quite simply, we couldn't have achieved what we have in 2020 without you.

AN UPDATE from Ian Crook, our CEO

In early November the Society relocated from its temporary accommodation to its new shelter and clinic. This move has been long awaited and was met with enthusiasm by all staff.

The initial response from Members, clients and customers has been very encouraging and we look forward to being able to provide a wider range of private clinic services, successfully re-home more cats and kittens and provide a wider range of merchandise for sale. There is also the possibility of a coffee shop!

When permitted the Society will recommence visits to aged care facilities and its educational initiatives which aim to encourage responsible pet ownership and highlight the benefits of companion animals. It is worth noting that during the lockdown associated with Covid the interest in adoption increased dramatically. The Society is establishing relationships with other like-minded organisations to increase the intake of cats and kittens for rehoming.

Throughout 2020 the Society continued to receive generous donations and was the beneficiary of several significant bequests. The Society continues to be dependent on this ongoing source of funding and is very appreciative of the support it receives. To maintain this income stream the Society has introduced a Regular Giving Program, Furever Home, and Jarrah's Circle which is an initiative to acknowledge and attract major donors and bequests. These programs are being coordinated by the Society's recently appointed Fundraising Manager.

2021 will be an exciting and successful year for the Society. On behalf of the staff and the Board I wish to thank all our Members, clients and customers for their strong support throughout 2020, at times in difficult circumstances

May I wish you and your families a safe Christmas and we look forward to seeing you at your new shelter and clinic in 2021.

REFLECTIONS ON 2020 from our team



Dr Peta Keown Senior Veterinarian

How would you describe 2020 at The Cat Protection Society (CPS)?

2020 has been a year of uncertainty.

What have been the biggest challenges that you and your team have had to manage this year?

The biggest challenge to the team was the constant change. You could come up with a new plan on the Monday, only to change it by the Wednesday. This was taxing on all members of the team.

We realised very early that Covid virus could be very contagious in a veterinary clinic setting. A consulting vet is in close contact with multiple people in a small consulting room all day. This meant the staff and the public would be at risk. So, we introduced distance consults which were very new, and definitely lacked the warmth of consulting in the same room as the cat owners.

The vet team split into two teams, which meant we had to find new ways to communicate and handover cases.

What were the positives and achievements from 2020?

Of course, we are very proud that we faced one day at a time and continued to function within new rules.

What have you been most proud of?

I'm proud that we continued to provide care to many cats and everyone remained safe.

What does the new CPS Shelter mean for your team?

The new facility is the light at the end of the tunnel for those that have worked here in temporary buildings and endured the trying times of Covid.

It will be nice to consult without needing to find your raincoat to go meet a client out the front (ha!)

3 words to describe new facility.

Bright, modern, spacious.

What does the 12months ahead look like at CPS?

I see us growing, employing more staff and treating more cats than ever before. We're getting dental x-rays and hoping to gain International Society of Feline Medicine accreditation. It should be wonderful for the cats of Melbourne.

Why should someone visit the CPS Vet?

The staff at CPS are passionate about cats and understands their behaviour. There are no noisy dogs to frighten them in the waiting room or hospital.



How would you describe 2020 at The Cat Protection Society (CPS)?

Filled with uncertainty and lots of challenges.

What have been the biggest challenges that you and your team have had to manage this year?

Definitely managing all the adoption applications and balancing the desire to have cats adopted out

of the shelter as quickly as possible whilst adhering to the protocols for Covid safe management.

What were the positives and achievements from 2020?

The new online adoption application process has worked really well. We can now gauge who is visiting the shelter and know a little bit about them before they come in. With this knowledge we can provide them with a tailored one-on-one experience which ensures they are ideally matched with a new cat or kitten that perfectly suits them. Logistically it also works really well for our staff. We often used to get inundated with visitors on the weekend and it could be hard for staff to manage, especially when it came to matching people to a cat that suited them, as it is hard to get to know someone in a short space of time. The one-on-one model means it is more thorough and people seem to make better choices when they are not rushed or have been left waiting. We've received a lot of positive feedback from our new adoptees.

They liked that we focused on them for an hour so we could cover absolutely everything, answer all their questions, and most importantly ensure they felt really comfortable with their new family member.

What have you been most proud of?

Still managing to do all the above while in temporary facilities. Also, very proud of the cats we have adopted out, some that were very challenging behaviourally, but with a lot of hard work and rehabilitation we got them over the line to learn to trust again.

Was there anything introduced during Covid that will now be incorporated into the running of the Adoption Shelter / Vet Clinic ongoing?

Adoptions by application and appointment.

What 3 words would you use to describe the new CPSV Facility?

Enriching, spacious, exciting.

What does the 12months ahead look like for you and your team?

Incredibly busy and rewarding.

Why should someone considering adoption come to CPS?

Why wouldn't you? We care and we help everyone that comes to us, we are very proud of what we will achieve. Everything specialising in cats only, why would you go anywhere else?

Each year, hundreds of kittens – some only a few hours old, come into the care of our Society. These small, vulnerable kittens rely on us, and as a not-for-profit organisation we are relying on cat lovers like you to make this lifesaving work possible.



Christmas is always a busy time for us. While this year has provided many challenges in how we work, the job at hand has not changed. As a Society we are dedicated to caring for cats and kittens in need and ensuring that each animal that comes into our care can find a loving family to call their own.

This Christmas, our wish is that all cats and kittens are healthy, loved, and happy in their furever home.

To do this, we have built a network of dedicated Foster Carers who are on call to give these beautiful cats the care and love they need to thrive. Our Foster Carers provide refuge and safety to mothers with litters who need extra support and a safe place to raise their kittens, as well as around-the-clock care including bottle feeds to tiny kittens who have the odds stacked against them.

Starlight and Butch were brought into our shelter along with their mother, who was sadly not able to care for her babies. At just a couple of days old, their eyes weren't even open yet. These precious little kittens needed our help. While their mum was being cared for, they were urgently checked over for any health issues and placed into our Foster Care program where they are receiving intensive care.

Their Foster Carer has been bottle feeding them every couple of hours, day and night, to ensure they receive the nutrients they need to grow big and healthy in these critical early stages, as well as grooming them and helping them to go to the toilet, just as their mother would have. Without this special care, Starlight and Butch simply would not survive - they are far too young.




Each day they are growing stronger, and they have started venturing out of the safety of their bed to explore their surroundings, showing their natural curiosity of the world around them.

After operating for over 70 years, we are excited to open the doors to Victoria's largest dedicated shelter for cats which will provide refuge for up to 300 cats.

Our new shelter includes an adoption centre which was custom designed by our Shelter and Veterinary teams, a feline dedicated vet clinic that is open to the general public, an education classroom, expansive retail store and café (opening in 2021).

Our Society Chief Executive Officer, Ian Crook said that he and our wider Cat Protection Society team are thrilled to be opening the new Shelter.

"This is an incredible opportunity to help more cats in need and engage with the local community,"

"We can now accommodate short term refuge for over 200 more cats in the Shelter than in our temporary facility and have also been able to significantly expand our veterinary services."



Being so incredibly young, the odds were stacked against him.



Chloe



The Cat Protection Society and an essential part of The Cat Protection Society Foster Care Network. Chloe has been providing Foster Care for almost 4 years, having provided short-term refuge and care to over 70 cats and kittens during that time.

When did you first join The Cat Protection Society team?

I started working for CPS as an animal attendant in early 2019 - it was a huge career change that came to me very suddenly, but it was the only job I could imagine changing industry for!

When did you first commence providing Foster Care for the Society?

I have been caring since January 2017. While unable to work full time after recovering from a back surgery, I thought it would be the perfect use of my free time, and I've never looked back!

How many cats and kittens have you provided short term care for?

I have cared for over 70 cats and kittens in that time. From scared teenagers, to pregnant mums, to neonate kittens requiring round the clock care, I have cared for a huge variety, and I am actually proud to say that I am yet to "Foster Fail" (adopt one of my fosters)!

What do you enjoy most about being a Foster Carer?

I just love watching their personalities grow as they become more confident, grow big and strong, and learn how to be household kitties. It is so rewarding to show them love that they may have never received before, and to get them to the point that they are ready for their forever homes.

What is your favourite memory or achievement as a Foster Carer?

Just recently I cared for my most difficult behavioural problem kitten ever. She was only around 7 weeks old and with her sister and mother but she refused to make any progress, hissing and spitting on approach. After 2 weeks of no change, I was nearly broken and ready to give up and let someone else try, when she finally accepted some cooked chicken from me and touched my fingers. From then on, she came along in leaps and bounds and was eventually rehomed to a fantastic family and she blesses them every day with lots of love and fun!

And what advice would you provide to others who may be interested in becoming a Foster Carer?

Make sure you have the time and space available before you commit to becoming a foster carer. It is super rewarding but can be as time consuming as a full-time job! And be prepared to fall in love with every single one, and give up a piece of your heart when you have to give them back!

6mths old ADOPTED 2020




Annie


He is using his litter tray twice a day, eating & drinking well also, I am so happy I have him. Thanks again.


She has been using her litter tray and we just can't believe how perfect she is already. She has been no trouble at all and we all love her So much already.
